Donor Coordination and Partnerships

On 12th of November, a meeting of the • Commission Réhabilitation des Zones Post-Conflit (CRZPC) took place, including some international NGOs intervening in the north of Mali. The follow-up on the conference on development of Mali, organized by the Malian government and OECD in Paris on 22nd of October, was discussed. In this regard, next actions will be to produce the final report of the MIEC (Mission d'Identification et d'Evaluation Conjointe) to be validated by the Comité de Suivi de l'Accord (CSA), and follow the disbursements' evolution of financial commitments announced by the Government of Mali and donors for humanitarian and development actions in the 3 years to come. The other topic in the agenda was about schools

opening which went smoothly across the whole country, except in Kidal region where all schools stayed generally closed but a dozen in Tessalit and Kidal communes, operating with 2,500 pupils according to UNICEF. It was decided to 1) take stock of the global situation on schools that are operating or not via the Technical Education Group and Education Cluster (the first one gathering donors, the second composed of donors, national and international NGOs and the Government); 2) to ask MINUSMA to facilitate all available information from the regions regarding that matter; and 3) to reflect, beyond the emergency, on the political dimension of the global educational situation in the whole country and on the donors' intervention in that regard and in line with the Government.

Peacebuilding Fund (PBF)

1. S&R undertook missions to Gao (12th-13th of November) and Timbuktu (16th-17th of November) for the Peacebuilding Fund (PBF) quarterly review, and had discussions with implementing partners on how best to manage and coordinate the PBF projects. Among implementing UN agencies who attended the review meetings, interest to speed up delivery was noted. A draft report with the baseline study and the global logframe for the entire PBF portfolio should be available by the end of 2015. S&R represented MINUSMA as part of the PBF Joint Steering Committee's support office. 2. of S&R accompanied by two members PBF Mali Joint Steering **Committee (Civil Society representative** and Government of Mali counterpart) participated from 16th to 20th November at a global conference organized in Durban by the Peacebuilding Support Office (PBSO) and the African Centre for Constructive Resolution of Disputes (ACCORD). The purpose of the workshop is to bring together practitioners from ACCORD, PBSO HQ and PBF users in the field to discuss how to improve the effectiveness of PBF support of national stakeholders in their efforts to consolidate peace. Countries represented included Burundi, Central African Republic, Guinea, Ivory

Coast, Kyrgyzstan, Madagascar, Mali, Niger, Somalia and South Sudan — in a combination of both longer-term and more recent recipient countries.

The PBF Mali team made a presentation on community-level monitoring of peacebuilding outcomes. The participation of the Malian Government and Civil Society in the workshop helped foster common understanding of PBF objectives and raise awareness on their political and strategic role within the Joint Steering Committee. A cross-border pilot initiative between Mali and Niger, both recent recipient countries, would be a considerable asset for both countries' programmes.

1 On 4th of November, instruments were officially handed over to the multi-ethnic regional orchestra Songhoy Star, which defended national and international cohesion for decades and whose equipment was destroyed during the 2012 occupation by armed groups. This project brings hope not only to Songhoy Star members (which have even rehearsed without equipment until then), but also to all communities in Gao as the initiative embodies and pushes for the resumption of cultural life and musical multi-ethnic tradition, both negated since 3 years. This QIP is sponsored by MINUSMA's Environment & Culture Unit and represents a budget of 18,765 USD. An inaugural concert is planned in December 2015 to celebrate peace and cultural diversity. On 16th and 17th of November, MINUSMA's Ζ. Civil-Military Cooperation unit (CIMIC), Engineering and S&R sections carried out a joint field mission to Menaka. The latter aimed at conducting a technical assessment on the Menaka airstrip to be rehabilitated under the Trust Fund in Support of Peace and Security in Mali. Approved for 450,000 USD through Canada's contribution and considered as a priority project in Gao's Stabilization & Recovery Plan, the rehabilitation requires solid technical capacities. S&R is currently working on identifying a suitable implementing partner. The mission also consisted in visiting recently redeployed Menaka Prefet, meeting local authorities on water management issues and assessing feasibility of 2 projects proposals related to a sports facility rehabilitation and public solar streetlights.



Mopti

On 4th of November, a QIP for the cow restocking and rehabilitation of a milk farm was officially handed over to the Women Association of Boni, Douentza cercle. The milk farm, which was managed as a service cooperative, was looted and destroyed by armed groups during the 2012 conflict. The farm was almost abandoned and let in advanced deterioration. At its first stage, the project supplies one milk cow per woman member (39 animals expected to produce 57,600 liters of milk), a 3-months provision of cattle food, and resulted in a new cow stable and fence. Sponsored by MINUSMA Civil Affairs Division and funded for 28,600 USD, this QIP will contribute to improve living conditions of the women involved and their community, developing guality milk production in Boni thus ensuring stable income for the women. Timbuktu

1 On 26th of November, the inauguration ceremony of the 3 manuscripts libraries (Imam Essayouti, Al-Wangari and Hamed Boularaf) rehabilitated in Timbuktu took place in presence of manuscripts owners' representatives, regional authorities and MINUSMA officials. Sponsored by MINUSMA's Environment & Culture Unit with the technical support of UNESCO and representing a budget of nearly 43,000 USD, this project marks the resumption of preservation activities in favor of the regional heritage. Thousands of manuscripts were destroyed in the aftermath of repeated attacks by armed groups, for instance the suicide bombing perpetrated near Djingareyber mosque on 28th of September 2013. The project is implemented by the *Mission Culturelle de Tombouctou*, under the supervision of the *Direction Nationale du Patrimoine*. Direct beneficiaries are the families owning manuscripts, but also the entire economic sector comprised of 200 copyists and woodworkers. Globally, communities from the northern regions and from all Mali are now able to safeguard one of the fascinating facets of their history, through those protected ancestral writings.



Financed by MINUSMA, Quick Impact Projects (QIPs) are community micro projects. These projects have a maximum cost of 50,000 USD and a maximum 6-months duration, in the areas of services and small public infrastructures rehabilitation, training and awareness-raising activities, employment and revenue creation. They must have both a quick and long lasting effect meeting priority needs of the population and aim at building confidence towards the peace process, the Mission and its mandate.

Between 1st of July 2015 until 30th of June 2016, a 4 million USD budget will be dedicated to approximately 114 QIPs. These projects will benefit mainly northern regions and will support requests from the Malian Government, international and national NGOs, international agencies and civil society. All projects are executed through local partners and businesses.

The UN Trust Fund in support of Peace and Security in Mali was created at the request of the Security Council (SC resolution 2085 (2012)). Member States can contribute earmarked and/or non-earmarked funds to the Fund, which aims to provide vital support to the Malian Defence and Security Forces (MDSF), assist the Malian Government in its efforts to ensure lasting peace and the return of State Authority and constitutional order, and support critical development and humanitarian interventions contributing to the immediate and long-term efforts by the international community to resolve the crisis in Mali.

It is supported by voluntary contributions from the following donors: Australia, Canada, Germany, Ireland, Luxembourg, the Netherlands, the United Kingdom and UN DOCO. The Fund's budget currently amounts to approximately 14 million USD, of which some 84 per cent has been attributed to projects.


Peacebuilding Fund in Mali -Overview

To deal with the political, institutional and security crisis that deeply destabilized Mali since 2012, the Malian Government and the United Nations System in Mali resorted to the Peacebuilding Fund (PBF) in order to support peacebuilding and reconciliation. The Government of Mali submitted an eligibility request to the Peacebuilding Support Office (PBSO) on 24th of February 2014 which was approved by Secretary-General of the United Nations on 2nd of April 2014.

In this context, the intervention of the PBF programme in Mali represents in its first phase 10.9 million USD, of which 10.6 have been attributed to 5 projects undertaken by UN agencies and MINUSMA. A Steering Committee oversees the whole programme and gathers the Malian Government, the civil society, international donors and the United Nations. The remaining 0.3 million USD goes to the Steering Committee Support Office.
