Donor Coordination and Partnerships

On 5th of May, S&R together with UNPOL exchanged with **a visiting CADRI mission** (Capacity for Disaster Risk Reduction Initiative) on MINUSMA's response capacity in terms of Disaster Risk Reduction and the type of response MINUSMA provided during the Ebola crisis. This multi-agency mission objective is to elaborate a National Action Plan on DRR for Mali.

As co-lead, MINUSMA (via S&R) participated in meetings of the **CRZPC** (Commission de Réhabilitation des Zones Post Conflit) on 7th and 27th of May with a large representation of donors: Germany, European Union-ECHO, Switzerland, France and Agence Française de Développement (AFD), Sweden, Belgium, Luxembourg, Denmark; and international organizations: OCHA, UNHCR, UNDP, WFP, UNICEF, IOM, FAO, World Bank, African Development Bank, Action contre la Faim, Handicap International, LuxDev, USAID and Solidarités International.

The overall discussion related to the capacity building initiative of France towards the MSAHRN (Ministère de la Solidarité, de l'Aide Humanitaire et de la Réconciliation Nationale) and to the preparation of the high-level political meeting with 4 ministries of GoM. It was agreed that there is a need for better coordination between the Government and the different actors involved in the aid, recovery and development assistance to Mali and for clarifying the institutional positioning of donors in reference to Annex 3 of the Peace Agreement.

On 13th of May, S&R section contributed to the **GEC** (*Groupe Exécutif de Coordination des Partenaires Techniques et Financiers*) discussions around donors' support to GoM for the implementation of the Algiers' inter-Malian Peace Agreement.

Talking points also included the increased coordination of donors with Humanitarian Clusters and OCHA and lastly, the review of the planned international budgetary support to Mali.

This was the occasion to debrief donors of the last CRZPC meeting (see 2), and define the key messages of the upcoming meeting between the Prime Minister (PM) and the extended Troïka (see 6) planned on 28th of May.

On 14th of May, **S&R discussed with the visiting UK delegation** current stabilization efforts, ongoing partnerships building with other stakeholders and challenges ahead. The delegation was interested in issues related to military capabilities, support to the local police and gendarmerie, and stabilization in light of the upcoming Mission mandate renewal.

5 • In preparation to the upcoming PM / extended Troïka meeting (see 6), the S&R section presented on 19th of May MINUSMA regional stabilization plans to the **PM Adviser**, **Mr. Alhassane BAH**, **and the** *Secrétaire Général* of the **MSAHRN**, **Mr. Samba BABY**. Both described the initiative as very important and showed their support to the plans.

Trust Fund (TF): 4 projects completed/nearing finalization and 6 projects under implementation out of 13 projects approved for a cost of USD 8,825,881 over a budget of USD 12,074,433 (contributions from Australia, Canada, Germany, Ireland, Luxembourg, the Netherlands, the United Kingdom and the World Bank)

PM / extended Troïka meeting took place as planned on 28th of May. The two main subjects discussed encompassed: (i) Implementation of the Algiers Agreement in its aspects related to the North's reconstruction funding strategy, emergency measures, the organization of a fundraising conference and the institutional architecture for the monitoring of the agreement. In addition, discussions around the decentralization process also took place with the African Development Bank and the EU; and (ii) Education: One of the current issues consists in conducting audits and assessment to evaluate the sector performance.

New DSRSG/RC/HC on board

S&R would like to welcome Mrs. Mbaranga GASARABWE, as new DSRSG/RC/HC for Mali.

Prior to this, she worked as the Assistant Secretary-General for the



Department of Safety and Security in New York, managing issues of safety and security for UN offices around the world. Ms. GASARABWE already served in Mali as Resident Coordinator and UNDP Resident Representative.

Gao

On 7th of May, S&R attended a meeting of the **CROCSAD** (Comité Régional d'Orientation, de Coordination et de Suivi des Actions de Développement), opened by the Governor, with the President of the Conseil Régional and Directors of Services Techniques in attendance.

During the meeting, Danish Refugee Council (DRC) presented a project recently developed to re-launch economic activities in Gao and Timbuktu regions. It aims at supporting professional training and so far 1727 projects have been selected on the two regions. Read more about DRC in Mali:

Mopti

On early days of May, S&R explored with the **Secretary General of the** *Conseil Régional des Jeunes* how to design stabilization and recovery projects involving local youth. One week later, S&R Mopti presented a local youth organization from Youwarou QIPs procedures and encouraged the association to submit a project proposal in support of the young community.

On 8th of May, MINUSMA's **ASIFU** (All Sources Information Fusion Unit) presented its services within the mission to the S&R Mopti team. The latter stressed the importance of ASIFU covering the Mopti region as an important means to address stabilization needs in an informed manner based on conflict and intelligence analysis. The ASIFU gathers information on the Political, Military, Economic, Social, Infrastructure and Information domain, tailored to the needs of a multi-dimensional mission as MINUSMA. The collected information is fused, analyzed and transformed into an intelligence product that meets the requirements of the Mission.

S&R Mopti consulted the **Economic and Finance Advisor of the Governor** in view of identifying a pilot project which could be submitted to donors for funding in view of dividends for peace. Following consultations with the President of the *Conseil Régional*, the rehabilitation of the fishing port in Konna was recommended. The port which was bombarded during the 2013 Serval military operations, would contribute to increased socioeconomic interdependence and social cohesion beyond Konna itself, including the Tenenkou, Youwarou and Douentza cercles.

On 8th of May, S&R and Head of Office of Gao got together with the **Deputy Director**— **Programme of Handicap International**(**HI - Bamako**) on mission to the region. S&R presented the section's mandate and activities, including QIPs, and encouraged HI to support the Gao boarding school for blind people that is in dire need of assistance.

Handicap International informed about their 4 projects in the region on (i) Social cohesion, (ii) Education and awareness on explosive remnants (financed by UNICEF), (iii) Assistance to victims of explosive remnants (financed by UNMAS) and (iv) SGBV. HI & S&R explored possibilities to collaborate on QIPs projects.

Timbuktu

On 20th of May, **a QIP project was officially launched** in Timbuktu in presence of representatives of the *Conseil Régional* and the *Académie de l'Enseignement*, **for the rehabilitation of a dormitory in** *l'Hégire* **institute**. The *Académie* representative thanked MINUSMA for its support to the only centre in Mali dedicated to the training of Arabic professional teachers, a project which will improve living conditions for trainees coming from every part of the country and revitalize the training activities in the region.

Bamako

On 27th of May, the launch of rehabilitation works of three different security infrastructures took place: the Brigade d'Investigations Judiciaires (BIJ), the Centre d'Instruction de la Garde Nationale (CIGN) and the Centre Opérationnel de la Gendarmerie

Nationale (COG). These QIP projects are expected to provide acceptable working conditions enhance and performance of the security staff, thus to ensure better protection of civilians.

On 19th of May, a representative of the French Cour des Comptes, accompanied by a French diplomat from the Embassy in Bamako visited Gao. The visit was part of a report to the French Parliament on Government contributions to UN peacekeeping. This was also an occasion to meet 20 civil society representatives of Gao to assess the impact of MINUSMA's support to the population and visit the MINUSMA integrated camp, including Barkhane.

On 26th of May, the Regional Commander of UN Police and a Gao Governor's *Chef du Cabinet* proceeded to the **official launch of the rehabilitation of the** *Garde Nationale* **building**, financed through a QIP, «a new initiative from MINUSMA complementing others already realized by the UN Mission in the city», said the Governor's representative.





The fund's budget currently amounts to approximately US\$ 12 million, of which some 75% has been attributed to projects.


