Fast Facts - Uniformed Personnel

In its **Resolution 2227** (29 June 2015), the Security Council authorized 11,240 military personnel and 1,440 police personnel for MINUSMA until 30 June 2016.



MANDATE

- Support the Malian authorities in stabilizing key population centres, notably in the North of Mali, to **deter threats** and prevent the return of armed elements to those areas.
- **Protect civilians** under imminent threat of physical violence.
- Support the implementation of the **ceasefire and confidence-building measures** on the ground, consistent with the provisions of the agreement for peace and reconciliation in Mali.
- Support national, and coordinate international, efforts to **rebuild the Malian security sector**, especially the police and gendarmerie through technical assistance, capacity-building, co-location and mentoring programmes.

SECURITY & PROTECTION

1 July 2013 - 30 April 2016 :

43,905 military patrols and **48,390** police patrols to deter threats and protect civilians

310 tons of weapons and munitions confiscated and destroyed

11,352 members of the Malian security forces trained by UN Police

10,320 military personnel
91,96% deployed in the regions

1,105 police personnel
95,25% in the regions
