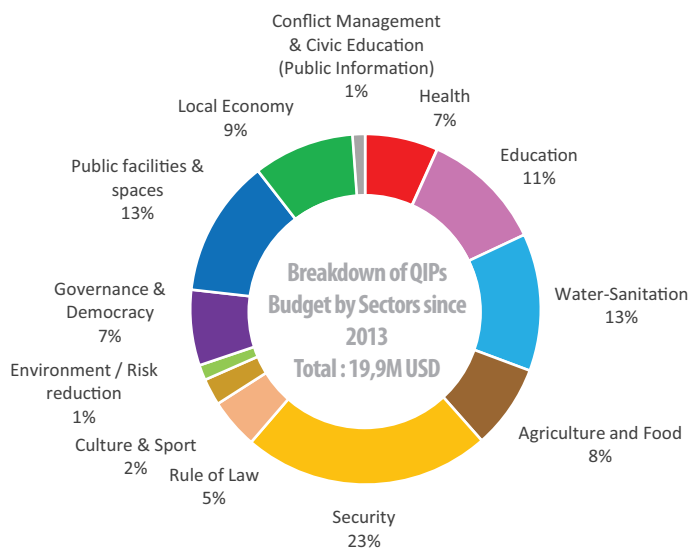


Financed by MINUSMA, Quick Impact Projects (QIPs) are community micro projects. These projects have a maximum cost of US\$ 50,000 and a maximum 6-months duration, in the areas of services and small public infrastructures rehabilitation, training and awareness-raising activities, employment and revenue creation. These projects must have both a quick and long lasting effect meeting priority needs of the population and aim at building confidence towards the peace process, the Mission and its mandate.

From its creation in 2013 until 30th of June 2019, the Mission financed 525 projects for approximately US\$ 19.9 million. Between 1st of July 2018 until 30th of June 2019, a US\$ 4 million budget is dedicated to approximately 113 QIPs. These projects will benefit mainly northern regions and will support requests from the Malian Government, international and national NGOs, international agencies and civil society. All projects are executed through local partners and businesses.

These projects have contributed to strengthen **social cohesion**; improve access to **basic health services and water**, enhance **security**; revitalize **basic education**, prevent **conflict** and **promote the use of pastoral and agricultural resources**; to strengthen **the economic resilience** of households affected by the crisis; create **temporary and long-term jobs**; **rehabilitate cultural heritage**; ...

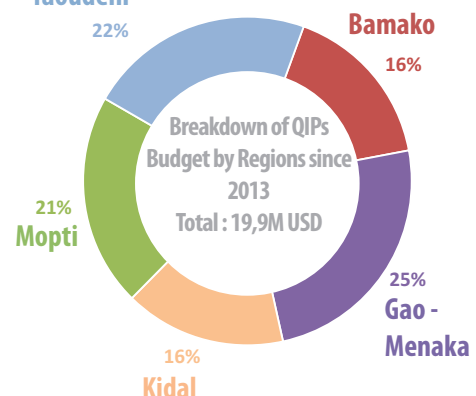
