

QIPs Overview - Mali -



Financed by MINUSMA, Quick Impact Projects (QIPs) are community micro projects. These projects have a maximum cost of US\$ 50,000 and a maximum 6-months duration, in the areas of social cohesion, prevention and alternative management of conflicts, strengthening of the organizational and structural capacities of civil society actors; small community infrastructure and basic needs as well as initiatives to support the return of administration and good governance; livelihoods, job creation and vocational training. These projects must have both a quick and long lasting effect meeting priority needs of the population and aim at building confidence towards the peace process, the Mission and its mandate.

From its creation in 2013 until 30th of June 2020, the Mission financed 616 projects for approximately US\$ 23.9 million. Between 1st of July 2020 until 30th of June 2021, a US\$ 4,8 million budget is dedicated to approximately 120 QIPs. These projects will benefit mainly the regions of North and Center and will support requests from the Malian Government, international and national NGOs, international agencies and civil society. All projects are executed through local partners and businesses.

These projects have contributed to strengthen social cohesion; improve access to basic health services and water, enhance security; revitalize basic education, prevent conflict and promote the use of pastoral and agricultural resources; to strengthen the economic resilience of households affected by the crisis; create temporary and long-term jobs; rehabilitate cultural heritage; ...
